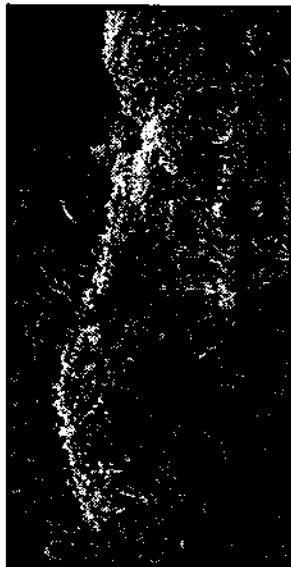

Looking westwards, there is a spectacular view of the Llyn peninsula pointing towards Ireland and the beaches of southern Llyn, with the two St Tudwal Islands situated off Abersoch. Looking east, from north to south, the mountains of Snowdonia, Moelwyn and Rhinog are visible, and on a clear day the Welsh coast is visible all the way down to Pembrokeshire.

Allforiwyd cynnyrch amaethyddol Llyn i Loegr, llawer ohono ar y mor, ond arferai'r porthmyn hefyd yrru gwartheg a deifad ar hyd llwybrau adnabyddus. O'r 18fed ganrif ymlaen, roedd Llyn yn ffinhonnell gyfoethog o wartheg, a gyrwyd 3,000 o Wartheg Duon Cymreig dros y brynau yn flynyddol.

Agricultural produce was exported to England, much of it by sea, but cattle and sheep were also driven on foot. From the eighteenth century, Llyn was a rich source of cattle, and 3,000 head of Welsh Blacks were driven each year over the hills.

Mae rhwydwaith llwybrau cefn gwlad Penrhyn Llyn, a ddatblygwyd gyda chymorth Awdurdod Datblygu Cymru, yn cynnwys lonydd glas, llwybrau cyhoeddus a lonydd. Dylid dilyn yr arwyddion bob amser.

Awgrym yn unig o'r llwybr a geir yma, a dylid defnyddio'r taffenni eto'r mapiau OS priodol i'r cylch (cyfres Pathfinder).

The footpath network on the Llyn Peninsula, developed with the aid of the Welsh Development Board, includes tracks, public footpaths and country lanes. Signposts should be followed at all times. This leaflet is intended as a guide only, and should be used in conjunction with the relevant OS map/s from the Pathfinder series.

Yn 1985 sefydlwyd Prosiect Rheolaeth Cefn Gwlad Llyn gan Gyngor Dosbarth Dwyfor. Gwneir gwaith ymarferol ar llwybrau cyhoeddus a gwarchod y tirun er mwyn diogelu'r amrywiaeth o fywyd gwylt, megis y frân goesgoch a wellir ar ein llo.

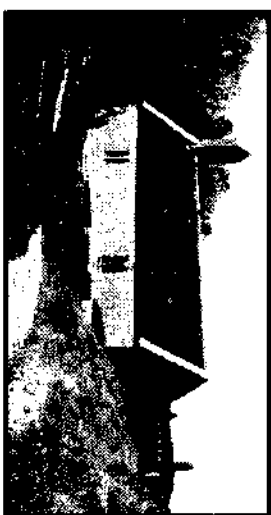

Yn ardal gyfoethog o ran archaeoleg, mae ym mhwyf Pistyll pob math o olion cyn-hanesyddol, systemau caeau, cyflau Gwyddelod hir a chwn, yn ogytal â chroes wedi ei cheffio ar garreg ger Tir Bach sydd o bosib yn dyddio o'r 8fed-9fed ganrif. Mae rhannau o Eglwys Pistyll yn dyddio o'r 12fed ganrif, ac oddi mewn i'r eglwys mae beddyddfaen hynod sy'n dyddio o'r un cyfnod.



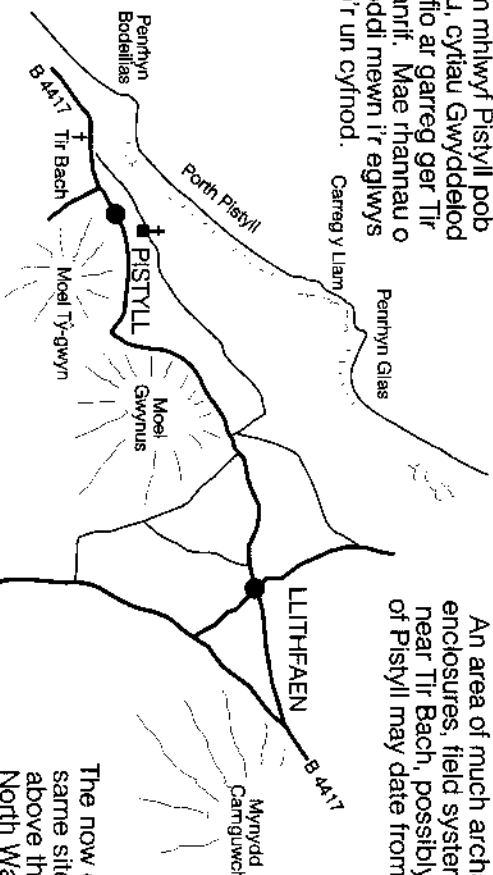
Eglwys Pistyll

Bu daearog Llŷn yn elfen bwysig yn ei heitfeddiaeth diwydiannol a diwylliannol, a cheir byrniau cadarn creigiog a chlogwyni o wenithaen caled. Bu yn anodd erioed gwneud bywoliaeth o'r tir, gan fod y priddoedd o'r creigiau hyn mor sal, ond serch hynny mae amaethyddiaeth wedi chwarae rhan allweddol mewn ffurfio'r tirlun presennol, ac yn parhau i wreud.

Ar safle hen chwarel wenithaen Carreg y Llam mae môr-glogwyn yn wynebu'r gogledd - orllewin. Gan godi hyd at 100 metr, dyma un o nythfeydd pwysicaf adar-mor yng Ngogledd Cymru, gyda gwyflogod, llus a gwyllanod coesddu, a niferoedd llai o adar drycin y graig, mullfran werdd a'r billdowcar yn nythu yma. Gwelir morio llwyd hefyd yn achlysurol ar hyd yr arfordir.

Yn draddodiadol, defaid fyddai'n porïr llystyfiant naturiol ar y gwastadrir enfawr o dir amaethyddol i'r gogledd orllewin o Bwlhel. Gan fod glaw trwm yn golchi maethyddion hantodol o'r pridd, mae'r borfa erbyn heddiw wedi ei gwella ar y rhan fwyaf o ffermydd. Mae llystyfiant naturiol megis gweiriau a blodau fel tresgl, llus a grug, yn parhau i oroesi ar lethrau serth ac anodd eu cyrraedd, er eu bod yn prysur brinhau.

Mewn rhannau is a gwlypach y fferm, ceir gwahanol llystyfiant sydd yn llawn mor gyfoethog, gan gynnwys y tegeirian mannog. Gwelir adar fel y llinos a chorhedydd y waun yn bwydo yma, tra bo'r ebedydd yn tywailt ei chan ddiddwedd o'r wybren uwchben. Ymysg y mamaliaid bychain sy'n byw yma mae'r llygoden bengron goch a llygoden y coed efo'i chynffon hir.

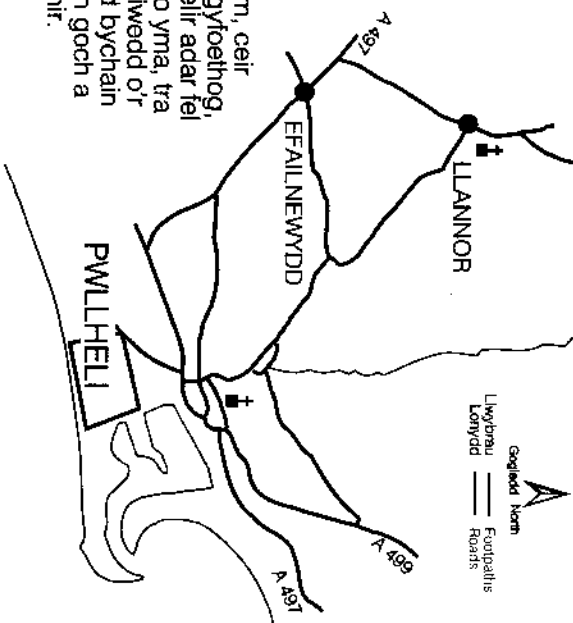


An area of much archaeological interest, the parish of Pistyll has relics of ancient enclosures, field systems, round and long huts, as well as an inscribed stone cross near Tir Bach, possibly dating from the 8th-9th century. Parts of the parish church of Pistyll may date from the 12th century, as does the noteworthy griststone font kept within its walls.

The geology of Llŷn is one of the most important factors in its industrial and cultural heritage, and hills and cliffs of unrelenting granite dominate the landscape. Agriculture has played an important role in the shaping of the man-made landscape of Llŷn, and still does, despite the fact that the soils from these rocks are very poor, making it difficult to wrest a living from the land.

The now disused granite quarry at nearby Carreg y Llam has on the same site a north-west facing sea cliff. Rising to about 100 metres above the sea this is one of the most important seabird colonies in North Wales, with nesting guillemots, razorbills and kittiwakes, and fulmar, shag, and cormorants in lesser numbers. Grey seals can also be seen along the coast.

Traditionally, sheep would have grazed the natural vegetation on the large plateau of agricultural land to the north west of Pwlhel. On most farms today the grazing has been improved, as high rainfall washes vital nutrients from the soil making the grazing poor. Natural vegetation such as various grasses growing in company with flowers such as tormentil, bilberry and heather, still survives on steeper and more inaccessible slopes, although becoming increasingly scarce.

In wetter, lower parts of the farm, a different though equally rich flora may be found including the beautiful heath spotted orchid. Meadow pipits and linnets feed here, while overhead the skylark pours out its incessant song. Amongst the small mammals to be found here are the bank vole and long-tailed wood mice.
